

New CADS Level 3

Teaching Intermediate and Advanced skiing

As the Technical Committee has highlighted at both 2016 Pre-Courses, the CADS Instructor Manual will be revised within the next 4-5 years. The revision will include intermediate & advanced teaching methodology. As we move forward with this, the CADS Technical Committee has decided to include these intermediate and advanced teaching methodologies in the CADS Level 3 Certification as they will be linked with the upcoming CADS Instructor Manual's revision.

The new intermediate and advanced teaching included in the CADS Level 3 aims to train our CADS Instructors to better teach advanced skiing to our CADS Students. All teaching is linked to the Gliding Experience and the Technical References from national association CSIA. To ensure success in the CADS level 3 course, it is strongly recommended for the candidate instructor to have a strong foundation and understanding of CSIA methodology and technical knowledge, plus the ability to meet the CSIA skiing requirements.

At step 6 of our instructor manual and CADS level 2 certification, we are looking at 'linked turns and beyond'... this is where the CADS Level 3 starts and moves forward into intermediate and advanced turn shapes and skill development.

The CADS Level 3 Booklet is being revised and will be posted on the CADS website in September.
